#### C/22/103 Infrastructure Issues

#### a. Phone Boxes

Cllr Halle had notified the Council that he would be making the order for materials, C/22/078a, in January. He had been unable to mend the door and at present it was not secured

#### b. Trout Pond

The Clerk explained that the EA had told the contractor that they could not do the work after 1<sup>st</sup> November. This was contrary to the accepted EA regulations that because it was structural river work, it could only be undertaken from the middle of October to the end of November. The Clerk said that part of the problem was that she had been unable to apply for the licence from the EA before the middle of August because TVBC had been unable to confirm the grant until then. TVBC had been delayed because the other awards had to be re-applied for due to a considerable rise in costs in Spring 2022. The Clerk said that it was probable that the project would not take place this year which may mean a rise in costs.

#### c. Pocket Park/Land Behind the toilets

Mr P Brooks, TVBC, had replied to the proposal but had said that the project would need to show community support in order for it to be taken forward. He suggested the Clerk should contact the TVBC Community officer for support. Cllr Jackson said that she would be happy to be involved.

The Clerk put forward the proposal that the work should be done using an HCC countryside grant. She asked the Council if it was considered necessary that the surface needed attention. Cllr Porter said he would walk the tarmaced route and assess it.

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#### C/22/104 Christmas

Cllr Foord confirmed that everything was on track for the installation of the lights and for the events that accompanied the "turning on" event due to be held on 3<sup>rd</sup> December. He said he did not expect that any other funds to be forthcoming.

The Chair brought item 10 up the agenda

#### C/22/105 Traffic Safety - Old London Road One-Way system Project

Cllr Boney explained that the WG now had a reply from HCC. Cllr Boney explained that the original proposal for the feasibility study was to look at 4 options. The option that was identified as the most suitable was the one way street, subject to considerations regarding cyclists. He felt this had been the agreed position. Now HCC was saying that they could not proceed because there was no casualty reduction, as per their policy. Cllr Boney said that the WG had now written to HCC to point out what the consequences would be for HCC, should anything happen to a child. He said the reputational damage and financial consequences needed to be considered. He said that HCC would be liable to be prosecuted under Health and Safety law which would look at a proper assessment of risk and therefore could result in a hefty fine for HCC. Cllr Foord commented that he felt a contraflow for cyclists was dangerous. The Clerk pointed out that these set ups were not uncommon. Cllr Porter commented that very few cyclists used Old London Rd. Cllr Foord said his grandchildren did.

#### C/22/106 High Street

It was agreed to refer the matter to the next meeting when more Cllrs would be present. Cllr Boney commented that the list of proposed changes to the High Street should be circulated. He said that he was very positive about a mini roundabout at Longstock crossroads though he recognised that Mr Sorrell (HCC) had not been. He said he felt that if HCC held a survey on the High Street it would reveal if there was a problem with dormitory parkers. He said that the creation of a "town square" would be the most controversial and ambitious part. Cllr Jackson commented that she felt the drains would need to be renewed.
